ISEP spent time developing a new carbon monitoring tool, expanded to include Scope 2 and 3 emissions – we're delighted at the positive feedback and the contribution from members. In 2019/20, the total emissions by members who reported again this year have reduced by 15%. Overall, we have now carried out 36,436 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub> savings through energy efficiency measures since we began capturing data in 2006. In addition to this, 35% of reported members are now on renewable electricity tariffs – we'll be looking to improve on this in the next year – while 70% of members recorded significant reductions from their baseline which is an impressive amount considering that many increased their numbers of staff and economic activity over that period. ISEP members represent over 15% of the borough's commercial carbon emissions.
